

Dare to be Different

ifferentiate yourself; something innovative and new; try to form a market space in which you can thrive without having to worry so much about having competitors breathing down your neck - this was the message expounded by the Minister of Industry and Primary Resources, Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Seri Utama Dato Seri Setia Awg Haji Yahya bin Begawan Mudim Dato Paduka Haji Bakar, speaking at Asia Inc Forum's 'Creating Breakthrough Growth' Local Business Development Forum on 6 November 2012 at the Empire Hotel & Country Club.

In his keynote speech, Yang Berhormat Pehin stressed the need for companies to assess whether they are suffering from "organisational pathologies" - traps that hinder breakthrough growth. The Minister brought up the example of two companies - Kodak and Apple. He pointed out how far Kodak - once a giant in the digital media/film business - has fallen, and how Apple transformed itself from the brink of collapse into the most valuable and admired company in the world. Yang

Berhormat Pehin explained that "Kodak was trapped inside its own familiarity. They preferred the familiar market position over the unfamiliar," and that "They did not pursue innovative development, even after forewarnings by their innovators and executives that digitisation was the future and will destroy their film business."

On the other hand, the success of Apple was built on deploying a strategy of innovation and market differentiation. Because of this, "Apple was able to create breakthrough inventions and, therefore, growth" the Minister added, before encouraging local businesses to tread along a similar path - to "always remain open, responsive and prepared to make hard decisions and venture into novel, emerging, as well as pioneering business activities."

Yang Berhormat Pehin also mentioned that MIPR cultivates an environment for local SMEs to flourish by adopting an integrated dynamic approach such as providing businesses access to extension and support services, capital, as well as industrial and agricultural sites.





A 'Shrimpy' Visit!

he Department of Fisheries, MIPR, and Integrated Aquaculture International LLC have co-hosted a delegation of 50 attendees from the Global Outlook for Aquaculture Leadership (GOAL) meeting for tours of Brunei's 'SPF Black Tiger Shrimp Project' and aquaculture facilities from the 4-5 November 2012. The GOAL meeting delegation, comprising of government officials, industry leaders, potential investors and aquaculture operators, represent a cross section of the

aquaculture and investment industries coming from Brazil, China, Dubai, India, Indonesia, Malaysia, Norway, Taiwan, Vietnam and the United States.

The tour was a two-day event with the first day consisting of visits to the Broodstock Development Centre, Shrimp Nutrition and Research Centre, Aquatic Animal Health Research and Service Centre and the shrimp processing plant at the Fish Landing Complex, Muara. A field trip to the Aquaculture Research and Development Centre, the 40 hectare site at the EcoAquaculture Park, and Telisai Phase II, the 459 hectare shrimp farm site in Telisai, Tutong District took place on the second day.

The 'SPF Black Tiger Shrimp Project' is a five-year programme developed by the Department of Fisheries collaboration with Integrated Aquaculture International of the United States to produce genetically improved specific pathogen-free black tiger shrimp and complementary technologies in shrimp health, nutrition and management.

Launched in London

Due to its capacity to enhance Brunei's Malay Islamic Monarchy ideology and values, and the rich cultural and religious diversity and accommodating nature of both Haji Sabtu, Director General of countries, such form of tourism

has been highly encouraged, leading to joint Islamic tourism packages between Brunei Darussalam and Malaysia which was initially discussed between Yang Berhormat Pehin Orang Kaya Seri Utama Dato Seri Setia Awg Haji Yahya bin Begawan Mudim Dato Paduka Haji Bakar – Brunei's Minister of Industry and Primary Resources, and Yang Berhormat Dato' Sri Dr. Ng Yen Yen - Minister of Tourism, Malaysia.
